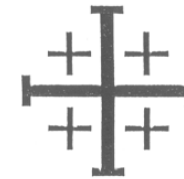

#### .A Brief History of St. Margaret's

St. Margaret's Parish has grown from twenty members in 1984 to over two hundred. Our members are interested in and involved with many local, diocesan and international mission projects. We are glad you are here and we hope you will join us regularly. Our Parish was named for St. Margaret of Scotland. With considerable zeal, Queen Margaret sought to change what she considered to be old fashioned and careless practices among the Scottish clergy. St. Margaret's energies were not limited to reformation of formal Church practices. She encouraged the founding of schools, hospitals, and orphanages, and used her influence with her husband, King Malcolm, to help her improve the quality of life among the isolated Scottish clans. Together, Queen Margaret and King Malcom rebuilt the monastery of Iona and founded Dunfermline Abbey, under the direction of the Benedictine monks. St. Margaret was canonized in 1250. St. Margaret's feast day is November 16.
